



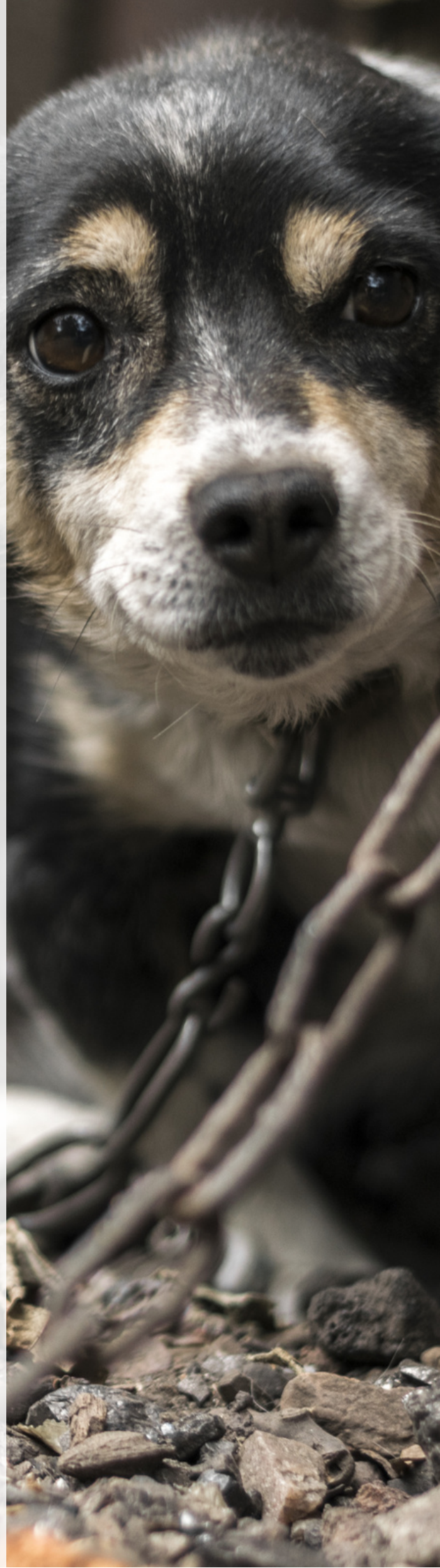
PRESS ANNOUNCEMENT:

Tomorrow **4th of May at 12.00 (CET)** at the **Press Club Brussels the Presentation (HYBRID)** of the international Report **'Towards prohibiting the chaining of dogs'**.

Several States or local territorial entities (e.g. Regions) have been recently banning this cruel and out-of-dated practice, which nevertheless still remains widespread.

With Maps and infographics **#Freedomfordogs (Green Impact, Fondazione Cave Canem and Animal Law Italia)** will illustrate the **current situation in several EU and non-EU countries as well as the main legal barriers to change.**

Supported by the contribution of several authoritative ethologists and experts, the Report is the first of its kind and it is reviewed on a yearly basis. **Dr Alexandre Barchiesi** (scientist, previously at Swedish Board of Agriculture) **will illustrate the ethological reasons for banning the keeping of dogs on chain and the current law in Sweden.**
